



LBC ANNUAL FUNDRAISER AT TREES ATLANTA NOVEMBER 1, 2023 6:30-9:30PM

Join Lifecycle Building Center on Wednesday, November 1, 2023 from 6:30-9:30pm for Revel in Reuse to support and celebrate LBC's efforts to create resilient and equitable communities through the reuse of construction materials. The event will be held at the new Trees Atlanta Kendeda TreeHouse facility, which has been reforested with more than 200 new trees and thousands of native plants.

During the event LBC will share impact stories highlighting its mission in action, including their Nonprofit Material MATCH program, free educational classes, and a new workforce development program, Breaking Barriers Through Deconstruction. Developed and implemented through a coalition formed by LBC called ReBuildATL, Breaking Barriers offers hands-on training in deconstruction, jobsite safety, residential energy efficiency, weatherization and construction, with participants provided access to career pathways such as material reuse, deconstruction, construction, and facilities management.

In 2023, twelve individuals graduated from the Breaking Barriers program thanks to the incredible dedication and support of our ReBuildATL partners, including 2M Design Consultants, Alair Homes, Atlanta Housing, Atlanta Technical College, Build Reuse, Center for Sustainable Communities, City of Atlanta's Moving Atlanta Forward initiative, DPR Construction, Environmental Protection Agency, Elemental Green Homes, Georgia State University, Georgia Tech, Greenshortz, Groundwork Atlanta, Grove Park Foundation, Home Depot Path to Pro, JE Dunn Construction, Juneau Construction, Master Home Remodelers, McCarthy Construction, MODA, Mothers Tongue, Re:Purpose Savannah, Skanska, Spelman College, Swinerton Builders, U.S. Green Building Council Georgia, Veterans Molding Minds, Weidmann Remodeling, and West Atlanta Watershed Alliance.

Following completion of the first Breaking Barriers cohort, Ayika Solutions and Southface Institute joined ReBuildATL to help expand the program to include energy-efficiency retrofits and weatherization improvements for disadvantaged residents in Southwest / Westside communities.

Funds raised through LBC's Revel In Reuse event will support training for a second Breaking Barriers cohort in Spring 2024, expansion of LBC's Nonprofit Material MATCH program and the relaunch of LBC's Home Performance and Do-It-Yourself workshops.

ABOUT LIFECYCLE BUILDING CENTER

Lifecycle Building Center reclaims usable materials through free deconstruction and pickup services and drop-off donations at our Reuse Center in Southwest Atlanta, where residents access these materials for a fraction of new material costs and nonprofits receive free materials through our Nonprofit Material MATCH program. Since 2011, LBC has saved 11.8 million pounds of material from disposal and saved our community \$5.4 million in material costs, including 388 free material grants to nonprofits.

Lifecycle Building Center is delighted to have our Revel In Reuse event at the Trees Atlanta Kendeda TreeHouse facility. This stunning project, designed by the architecture firm Lord Aeck Sargent, recently received the 2023 ULI Atlanta Development of Excellence in Mission Advancement award.

In early 2023, Trees Atlanta moved into their new Southwest Atlanta facility in the Oakland City neighborhood near Adair Park. On the east side of the property facing the Atlanta BeltLine Westside Trail is a meadow of native grasses surrounded by trees and native perennials. Beside the meadow is a special landscape installation, designed by renowned landscape architect Darrel Morrison, that replicates a granite outcrop appropriate to the Georgia Piedmont.
